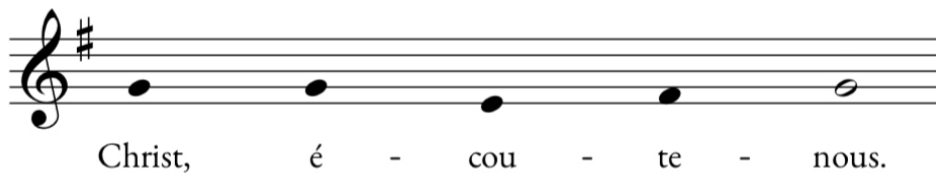

THE LESSONS

FIRST READING: Revelation 7:9-17

A Reading from the Revelation to John

After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne and to the Lamb!" And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, singing, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen." Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?" I said to him, "Sir, you are the one who knows." Then he said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. For this reason they are before the throne of God and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. They will hunger no more and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat, for the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

The Bishop blesses the water, first saying

Bishop The Lord be with you.

All **And also with you.**

Bishop Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All **It is right to give him thanks and praise.**

Bishop We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are

reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever.

All **Amen.**

THE BAPTISM

Each candidate is presented by name to one of the Cathedral Clergy, who then pours water upon the candidate, saying

Clergy *N., I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.*

All **Amen.**

Each newly baptized is then presented with a candle lit from the Paschal Candle with these words: Receive the Light of Christ.

Then the Bishop anoints the newly baptized, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying to each one

Bishop *N., you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.*

All **Amen.**

The Bishop prays over them, saying

Bishop Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.



Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God. Pour out your Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Body and Blood of Christ. Breathe your Spirit over the whole earth and make us your new creation, the Body of Christ given for the world you have made. In the fullness of time bring us, with all your saints, from every tribe and language and people and nation, to feast at the banquet prepared from the foundation of the world.

If you wish to partake in Communion, you may do so at one of five stations according to the location of your seat.

Those seated in the choir are asked to take Communion at the altar rail.

Those seated in the front half of the nave should proceed to the front of the church. Bread will be received at the steps of the choir. After receiving the bread, please proceed to the left or right according to your seat. If you wish to receive wine, you may do so from one of two ministers of communion located at the head of the side aisles. They will each have a chalice that contains the same consecrated wine.

Those seated at the back of the nave should proceed to the back of the church. Bread will be received at the baptismal font. After receiving the bread, please proceed to the left or right according to your seat. If you wish to receive wine, you may do so from one of two ministers of communion located at the end of the side aisles. They will each have a chalice that contains the same consecrated wine.

Sadly, we must be concerned about theft; please take your coat, purse, and other belongings with you as you leave the pew.

Please indicate to Ushers before the service if you require Communion to be brought to your place.

Red reminds us of ordination & ministry, whilst white reminds us of sainthood to which all are called.

Music Notes | A Multitude of Voices

In an effort to create a fuller and more inclusive picture of the richness of our musical heritage, we will be exploring music composed by women, BIPOC, and other historically under-represented composers.

This fall we will be focusing on women composers, including music composed by Sarah MacDonald, Mel Bonis, Jessica French, Stephanie Martin, Joy-Leilani Garbutt, and others. Despite being historically under-represented in the musical canon, women have been active contributors to all eras and styles of music from antiquity to contemporary.

Born and raised in Parry Sound, Ontario, **Eleanor Daley** (composer of this morning's baptismal anthem) received her Bachelor of Music Degree in Organ Performance from Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario. A prolific composer, Eleanor has a remarkable gift for melody. Her works are most notable for their sensitive interweaving of text and music. She has over one hundred published choral compositions and is commissioned extensively throughout North America. Included in her unpublished choral works are dozens of anthems, twelve Missae Breves, three pageants, and hundreds of descants, introits, and psalm settings. Her compositions have been widely performed, recorded, and aired throughout North America, Great Britain, Europe, South Africa, and the Far East. Her works are published by eleven publishing houses in Canada, the United States and Great Britain.
